FOREWORD

May I present to you the 28th Annual Report of the Gloucestershire Association of Youth Clubs and in so doing express my warm appreciation of all those friends, members and officers who have been loyal and generous in their support during the year. In particular, I extend to our Treasurer, Mr. P. D. Lee, the sincere thanks of the Association for his long service and expert care of finances. We wish him a long and happy retirement.

This has been a demanding and difficult year. We have been without an Organising Secretary and Training Officer and your Executive has been unable to make a new appointment because of the uncertainty about the level and continuity of direct financial aid from Gloucestershire County Council. It now appears that very real changes in the financial policy of the Local Education Authority with regard to this Association are being proposed and, if these are carried through, there will be serious consequences for our future work and for the nature of the partnership between voluntary effort and statutory provision. It must also be remembered that the local scene is set against a nationwide backcloth of financial restraint and growing evidence of educational retrenchment.

However, as you will see in the following pages, we have had a reasonable measure of success. The spirit of association is growing and the team work of young and old has caused what might have been a serious fall in organisation to be but a faltering step. In some of our work there has been temporary, though inevitable, cut-back but in many other ways there has been a healthy growth of realism, purpose and service. Constantly during the past year I have been impressed by the quality of personal giving.

The coming year will be one of increased challenge but this Association has the human resources to continue making a vital addition to the welfare and quality of living of young people in Gloucestershire.

WELCOME

The Association is pleased to welcome Mr. Alan Rice as part-time Liaison Officer. Since his appointment in February Mr. Rice has managed to visit nearly every affiliated Club thus maintaining the vital link between the Leaders and the Association so necessary in the temporary absence of a full-time officer. Mr. Rice has also made a valuable contribution by assisting with Competitions and Members' Council activities. By profession, Mr. Rice is a schoolmaster and was previously part-time Leader of Lower Tuffley Youth Club (affiliated to the Association). He was also a successful student of the Gloucestershire Association of Youth Clubs' Ninth Two Year Leadership Training Course.

SOME DETAILS OF THE YEAR'S WORK

While much has been achieved, this year has not been an easy one for the Association, due, in part, to the unfortunate loss of the services of the Organising Secretary in October. The position has, for the time being, been resolved by the appointment of a part-time Liaison Officer and the temporary promotion of the Administrative Secretary to Acting Organising Secretary, assisted by the Appeals Secretary. This arrangement has entailed a considerable increase in work for the existing staff but it has been possible to complete our year's programme, and we look forward to the appointment of a new Organising Secretary in the near future. Any attempt to survey all the activities of our fifty-eight affiliated Clubs during the past twelve months would, in this Report, be an impossible task. We have, however received a number of

reports and the following have been chosen for their general interest:—

BADMINTON ROAD METHODIST YOUTH CLUB

The club has experienced a considerable change over the past year in the way the members use the club. From being a purely social centre, the club has now become more involved in activities. Amongst these, Judo, Badminton and Table Tennis have been particularly popular. The use of the club adventure centre, The Fedw Farm, in Breconshire, has created a growing interest in Hiking, Hill and Mountain Walking, Climbing, Caving, Canoeing and Camping.

The seasonal activities of football, netball, cricket and rounders remain as popular as ever. Theatre visits have taken place, and the Drama section is active, having staged its own production in May. The members have undertaken community service by participating in house-to-house and sponsored walk charity appeals, and also Christmas Carol singing.

There is a lessening interest in residential and other special weekends outside the club, probably the result of a change in the predominant age group from late to early teens.

GLOUCESTER'S PHAB '68

The Association ventured this year, for the first time, into work with the physically handicapped, which proved to be a very stimulating and rewarding experience. The Course which was of a week's duration took place at The Star Centre, Ullenwood Manor, near Cheltenham, and was designed to give physically handicapped and able-bodied young people the opportunity to share and learn more about each others common interest and to meet young people from different parts of the country. The Course was so successful that plans are being made for another PHAB week during the coming year. If finances allow, the Association would like to make this a permanent part of the year's programme.

"BLUEPRINT FOR LIVING"

This Course, in human relationships, which consisted of four residential weekends for YOUNG ADULTS between the ages of 17-21, concluded with the final weekend, in July, 1968, at the National Association of Youth Clubs' headquarters. Eleven young people completed the course and were awarded N.A.Y.C Certificates.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING AND RESIDENTIAL CONFERENCE 1968

The 27th Annual General Meeting of the Association took place at St. Mary's College of Education, Cheltenham, on 22nd June, 1968. It was very well attended by Leaders, members, representatives of other organisations and friends. Lt.-Col. P. B. Carroll took the chair and conducted the formal

business of the meeting, after which he announced his resignation as Chairman of the Association which was accepted with much regret. It was, however, the unanimous wish of all those present that Col. Carroll be invited to become a Vice-President of the Association. This he kindly agreed to. Col. Carroll then invited the speaker—Mr. Paul Winterforde-Young—to present the Awards, Certificates and Badges for the various events. The meeting concluded with an amusing and enlightening talk by Mr. Winterforde-Young (Butlins Organisation) on "Commercial Provision for Young People."

The Annual General Meeting was followed by the Annual Conference attended by Leaders, Advisory Committee and Members' Committee members, and held at Sandywell Park Conference House, Cheltenham. The programme included a talk by Mr. Roger Jones (Chairman of the National Members' Council) on the National Members' Council theme "Communicate '68." The main topic for discussion during the week-end was Club Licencing approached by a Panel of Speakers who presented their views on:—

"A Club already licensed"—Mr. C. Cartmell, Youth Service Officer, Malmesbury area.

"The legal implications"—Mr. W. J. Todman, Solicitor, Cheltenham.

"The demands of young people over 18 years of age"—Mr. J. Panting, Leader of Patchway Youth Club, Bristol.

The members of the Conference recognised the need to explore the situation and its implications and were pleased to have the opportunity of discussing in detail this very controversial subject.

CLUB WEEK, 1968

Thirteen Clubs participated in Club Week raising a net total of £655/17/2. Of this amount 70% was retained by the Club to be used for its own benefit and the remaining 30% is equally divided between the National Association of Youth Clubs and the Gloucestershire Association of Youth Clubs thereby helping to maintain the provision of services to the Clubs. CONGRATULATIONS, for the second year in succession, to Down Ampney Youth Club who collected the highest amount per member. They will again be presented with the Association's Certificate and Badge. The Association is grateful to all Club Leaders; Club members, and, of course, the general public for their generous support of Club Week.

CANDLELIGHT CAROL SERVICE

Once again the Gloucester Cathedral was filled to capacity on the occasion of the fifth Annual Carol Service held in conjunction with the Diocesan Youth Committee. Nearly 2,000 young people from all parts of the county provided the only source of light in this ancient and beautiful Cathedral with hundreds of small tapers during the candlelight part of the Service.

The Christmas message was given by Brother David of Stroud's Community of the Glorious Ascension, and the Bishop of Gloucester, the Rt. Rev. Basil Guy read the Gospel for Christmas Day. After the first six readings by Youth Club members, two modern folk carols were sung, to their own guitar accompaniment, by Richard Potts and Veronica Smith. The singing was led by young members of Longlevens and St.

Aldate's Church choirs. The organ, played by Mr. John Sanders, was supplemented by the 70 piece Gloucester Christmas Orchestra, conducted by Mr. Tony Hewitt Jones. The Association is deeply indebted to the Rev. Eric Evans, and all those concerned in the organisation of this event. The proceeds of the collection was shared between the Association's work with physically handicapped young people, "Shelter", and the Adolescent Unit of the Mental Health Trust.

LEADERS' MEETINGS

Meetings for Leaders, or representatives, of affiliated Clubs in the County have been arranged regularly during the year, both north and south. Although attendance has not been large, the meetings have been profitable and have stimulated considerable discussion and joint action. The Association is grateful to the convenors of these meetings—Miss Betty Jackson, St. Stephen's Youth Club, Cheltenham (North) and Mr. J. Panting, Patchway Youth Club (South)—for their continued enthusiasm. Miss Jackson and Mr. Panting also represented the Association at the National Leaders' Conference, held at Nottingham University.

REMINGTON JUNIOR LEADERSHIP AWARD

Jennifer Hacker of Stoke Gifford Youth Club, Bristol, and David Johnson of Mangotsfield Methodist Youth Club, were selected to represent the Association in this Award held by the National Association of Youth Clubs in London, in March,

Howgate (representing Industry) and the Rev. J. Whales. After each talk discussions took place resulting in some lively questioning by the students. Saturday evening entertainment, took the form of folk singing, provided by Kevin Adams of Badminton Road Methodist Youth Club.

March Week-end at Sandywell Park:

"ESCAPE" the theme of the second week-end was structured by Mr. Donald Jones, Gloucestershire Training Officer,

COMPETITIONS 1968-1969

The following competitions held during the past year, were well supported by approximately 450 young people from Clubs all over the County. The finalists represented the Association in the South West Regional Finals, which were held at Hereford. All teams gave a creditable performance at Regional level and the Netball Team (Thornbury Youth Club) were fortunate in winning through to represent the Association and the South West Region in the National Finals to be held at Crystal Palace.

Results of Competitions
