Annual Review 2019/20

INFOBUZZ offers therapeutic and practical support for families and young people with complex needs.

> **OUR VISION** is for families and young people to have the strength to cope with life's challenges and the ability to change their future.

We work towards achieving this vision by delivering services in three areas:

Mental Health
School & Community
Criminal Justice

The last year has been one of growth for Infobuzz. We have been pleased to expand our services and begin new partnerships enabling us to work with some of the most vulnerable families and children in the County.

We have welcomed a new Art Psychotherapist to the team, taken on a therapy dog and delivered a project in partnership with the Home Office to tackle levels of violent crime.

In 2019/20 we are pleased to report that:

470 people received intensive intervention with Infobuzz.

Over **10,000** attendances were made across our school, prison and community training sessions.

95% of clients would recommend Infobuzz to a friend in need.

100% feel better able to cope with life's challenges after working with Infobuzz.

95% feel better informed.

Mental Health Services

Infobuzz supports FAMILIES & YOUNG PEOPLE

to address their mental and emotional needs through a range of specialist counselling and therapeutic services.

185 clients have been referred for counselling.

100% felt more positive about the future.

95% of clients felt their mental health had improved.

91% felt less likely to engage in risky behaviours.

Linked UP and Linked Up +

Funded by St James Place Foundation & Gloucestershire Clinical Commissioning Group.

Delivered in partnership with Young Gloucestershire.

The two projects offer a wraparound service with Infobuzz providing counselling and Young Gloucestershire delivering mental health focused youth work. Young people aged 16-25, including those in or leaving care, are able to address the emotional and practical challenges of dealing with their mental health. Last year we supported **185** young people delivering **2,271** counselling and youth work sessions.

Art Psychotherapy

Funded by Children in Need.

Infobuzz welcomed an Art Psychotherapist to the team, offering support to our Hidden Victim's children who were struggling with their mental and emotional health. This intensive work involves the child, parents and teachers.

Art & Photography Commissioned Programmes

We have launched a series of six-week programmes, suitable for one-to-one delivery or small groups, working with children who are experiencing emotional or behavioural difficulties. The programmes use the mediums of art and photography to help children open up about their thoughts and feelings with a professional.



School & Community Services

Infobuzz works with **SCHOOL & COMMUNITY GROUPS** to provide young people with life skills to support a positive future.

413 school sessions delivered with **9,167** attendances.

We worked with **16** secondary schools and FE colleges to deliver assemblies, classroom sessions and bespoke group work. Our most popular sessions included drug awareness, mental health and relationships and consent.

We delivered classroom sessions with **14** primary schools through our Move-Up programme which prepares year six students for the move to secondary school.

EmpowHer

Funded by Spirit 2020. Delivered in partnership with Young Gloucestershire, UK Youth and the British Red Cross.

EmpowHER is a group work programme that aims to empower young girls and women to lead change. Infobuzz has supported **42** young girls to complete the programme in primary schools across the County.

Qualifications

We have developed a series of NOCN Entry Level qualifications for adults who are in receipt of benefits. Last year we delivered **94** of these qualifications giving adults the opportunity to regain their confidence to train and work. Qualifications included Nail Art, Creative Arts and Creative Cosmetics.

Training for Volunteers & Professionals

The Infobuzz staff team continue to offer personal development opportunities across the County including specialist training in substance misuse and understanding mental health. **195** volunteers & professionals and **35** foster carers trained with us last year.

Criminal Justice Services

Infobuzz provides innovative intervention work for **OFFENDERS & THEIR FAMILIES** to break the cycle of crime.

Hidden Victims of Crime

Funded by The National Lottery Community Fund, St James Place Foundation and Children in Need. The project provides advice and guidance, counselling, mediation and advocacy to families coping with the impact of a family member going to prison.

178 individuals from 97 families were supported.

100% of clients felt better able to cope.

91% of young people felt they were less likely to engage in risky behaviour. **90%** of clients felt their situation had improved.

Home Office Project

Delivered in partnership with Gloucestershire Police, Safer Gloucestershire Violence Prevention Group, Office of the Police Crime Commissioner and Community Safety Partnerships.

The project aims to reduce violent and knife crime in Gloucestershire. Infobuzz's role focuses on early intervention, working with primary schools in key areas of the County where violent crime is prevalent.

We offer education and support for families and provide access to therapeutic services. **396** young people and parents attended our sessions.

Work in Prison

Funded by Avon & Wiltshire NHS and National Health England. Last year we delivered **177** sessions with **840** attendances. Our sessions are designed to offer personal development whilst in Eastwood Park Prison providing the opportunity to deal with difficult emotions. The number of women attending has risen and we have been able to build positive relationships with women who have complex needs and wouldn't normally engage with rehabilitation activities.

Young Gloucestershire is a county-wide charity that supports young people, who are facing challenges in their lives. Their vision is for young people to have the confidence, motivation and skills to improve their lives.

A Word From Our Chair


